1.2 The city of Passau

Widely considered one of the loveliest cities in Germany, Passau is situated in the southern foothills of the Bavarian Forest at the confluence of the rivers Danube, Inn and IIz.

Having been razed to the ground in the great fire of 1662, Passau was rebuilt according to designs by Italian master builders, which is where it gets its Mediterranean baroque flair from. It is partly for this reason that Passau is also known as the 'Venice of Bavaria'. Atop a small hill in the Old Town sits St. Stephen's Cathedral, the largest baroque cathedral north of the Alps.
